Manager's Article

Well, I do hope that everyone survived the big storms that we had so far this new year. As some of you are aware, there was a major power outage for about 3 days within Blue Lake Springs and the surrounding areas. There were also a number of trees that came down due to the heavy snow loads that we experienced. PG&E worked hard to restore all power. If you would like to receive updates about the weather conditions in Blue Lake Springs, you can go to the Blue Lake Springs website at www.blsha.com or sign up for the email announcement and they will be sent to you on a regular basis. You can also sign up for the Restaurant Special and Board Minutes.

When it snows, the Association office receives numerous calls regarding the plowing of the roads and if there are berms in front of driveways. Blue Lake Springs Homeowners' Association has no control over the plowing of the County roads. If you have questions or

concerns, it is recommended that you call the County Road Department at 209-754-6402 and County Up-date Snow Removal at 209-754-6017. Also, if it snows, you most likely will have a berm in front of your driveway. How big depends on where your cabin is located. For instance, Pebble Beach receives more snow than Moran Road so the berm will be higher.

On another note, the Winter Recreation Committee has been hard at work planning a multitude of events, so make sure you check each issue of the Lodge Log to see what is up and coming. Also, signing up for the email announcements is a great way to be reminded. Your support is needed to keep these events going. Recreation is also starting to plan this year's fun in the sun. Our Recreation Director has been hard at work planning summer activities for families to enjoy and has packed the summer calendar full. Interesting note: last year's summer attendance was over 30,000 members and families of members using the facilities. Fly-In-Lake had over 5,700. These are great numbers for three months of fun. The restaurant in 2009 had an attendance of approximately 5,300 for weekend dining. This is down from 2008 by about 125 members and 622 members from 2007. We need to thank those part-timers as they made up the majority of the 2009 attendance.

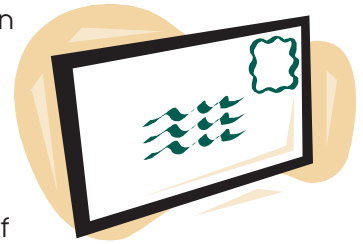

Please consider running for the Board of Directors of this beautiful Social and Recreation Club. The term is for three (short) years with one meeting each month. What a great excuse for a trip to Blue Lake Springs! Our Directors are limited to a three year term and must sit out a year before becoming a candidate again. This June, there will be two openings and YOUR business acumen and independence is needed.

While approximately 85% of our Members are Non-residents, recent Boards have been comprised mostly of resident Members and as one stated, "there are a

few of us who run everything up here." This does not lend confidence toward proper representation of Members.



Although Members have expressed concern over the growing subsidy of the restaurant since 2002, which is paid through our Dues, this subsidy has increased over 130% and the loss for weekend dining is estimated at over \$75,000 for 2009. Since the majority of restaurant benefactors and beneficiaries are resident Members and their guests, this direction may be reflective of some who are not concerned with the entire Membership's interests.

H₂O Highlights

Dear Shareholders,

I hope everyone enjoyed the Christmas Holidays. Blue Lake Springs has received several feet of snow the past two months. The snow is accompanied by cold weather which leads me into the next subject—Water loss due to improper winterizing of homes. In the month of December, 2009, seventeen homes required Water Company employees to shut off service due to freeze damaged water pipes either inside or outside the home. Over 600,000 gallons of water were lost due to these breaks. The Rules and Regulations (paragraph 8) states that shareholders are responsible for the cost of lost water as well as a \$100 fine for the first offense and a \$200 fine for a second offense. In the past, your Board of Directors have been reluctant to impose these fines but with the ever increasing cost of water we may have no choice in the future. The Board has asked me to bring this issue to your attention in this newsletter. The subject will be discussed in more detail at the Annual meeting on June 5, 2010.

We are still on track for the Mauna Kea Water Main Project which includes 4 new hydrants and new 6" water mains on St Andrews Court and a portion of Snow Flake Drive. Enjoy the spring skiing and don't forget to winterize your cabin when leaving.

Reminder to Members Who Rent and Provide Guest Cards
